GRAS Notice No. AGRN 46

Dear Mr. Grabherr:

The Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) Center for Veterinary Medicine (CVM, we) is granting your request, dated September 17, 2021, to cease our evaluation of generally recognized as safe (GRAS) notice No. AGRN 46, filed on April 9, 2021.

The notice informs FDA of Agromed Austria GmbH's view that the intended use of wood-based lignocellulose is GRAS, through scientific procedures, as a source of dietary fiber for swine and poultry at a use rate up to 2% for pigs, piglets, broilers, laying hens, and turkeys and 4% for sows. In a teleconference on September 8, 2021, CVM discussed the issues identified during our evaluation of the notice. Specifically, chemistry, manufacturing, and controls concerns on origin of the contents of undesirable constituents and validated methods to quantify these undesirable constituents were identified. These questions will also impact the evaluation of the target animal safety section of the Notice. In addition, the utility section raised questions about the application of the provided literature to some of the intended species. Also, CVM discussed the opportunity for Agromed Austria GmbH to request we cease our evaluation of AGRN 46 and to re-submit a new GRAS Notice in the future.
