Outreach Activities

- Health Canada has been actively engaged in outreach activities over the last few years.
- More recently, webinars and teleconferences were held with MEDEC and the Canadian Council of Innovators (CCI).



Outreach Activities

- The Department continues to participate and present at various conferences (RAPS, OSMA, MEDEC, etc.)
- We have received considerable feedback from stakeholders about MDSAP and the transition.



Outreach Activities

 The feedback received contributed to the dialogue on the transition and helped shape some of the changes to our transition approach.



- In December 2017, Health Canada sent an electronic survey to all medical device licence holders.
- A total of 1455 companies responded.



- When asked if they intended to transition to MDSAP:
 - -74% of respondents said yes
 - 14% said no
 - 12% were unsure



- Of those indicating that they would transition:
 - 36% said during the first half of 2018
 - 42% said in the second half of 2018
 - 16% claimed difficulty scheduling their audit

Note: other answers are not included here



 61% of respondents indicating that they would not transition stated that this was because their sales in Canada do not justify the cost of the MDSAP transition.

• Another 16% stated that cost was the overall determinant.



 A further analysis of the negative respondents revealed that for the most part these are small (and very small) companies with low sales in Canada.



 The main factor under consideration for those unsure about the transition was cost (56%).



- To date, Health Canada has received about 170 MDSAP certificates
- This accounts for about 10% of licences.



- However, according to the Master List approximately 1800 facilities have been registered into the program.
- Over 1000 audits have taken place already.



 While it is understood that not all facilities are Legal Manufacturers, there appears to be a significant gap in the number of certificates



 It is understood that AOs are experiencing higher than normal certification volumes and that delays are frequent.



 Manufacturers are reminded to submit their MDSAP certificate to Health Canada if they have not done so already.
