


## ACCESS & FUNCTIONAL NEEDS

## **Definitions:**

Seniors – 65 years of age or older. Immigrant – foreign born. Hearing difficulty – deaf or had serious difficulty hearing.

**Vision difficulty** – blind or serious difficulty seeing even when wearing

Cognitive difficulty – serious difficulty concentrating, remembering, or making

Ambulatory difficulty – serious difficulty walking or climbing stairs. Self-care difficulty - difficulty dressing or bathing.

Medical condition - diabetes; asthma; history of a heart attack, angina, or

coronary heart disease.

**Serious mental illness** – score of >13 on the Kessler-6 psychological distress

Adult family home - licensed to provide housing and care services for up to six adults in a regular house located in a residential neighborhood. Nursing home – provides 24-hour supervised nursing care, personal care, therapy, nutrition management, organized activities, social services, room, board, and laundry. **Low-income housing** – housing units managed by Spokane Housing
