


In Spokane County

Definitions:

Seniors – 65 years of age or older. Immigrant – foreign born. Hearing difficulty – deaf or had serious difficulty hearing. Vision difficulty – blind or serious difficulty seeing even when wearing glasses.

Cognitive difficulty – serious difficulty concentrating, remembering, or making decisions.

Ambulatory difficulty – serious difficulty walking or climbing stairs. Self-care difficulty – difficulty dressing or bathing. Medical condition – diabetes; asthma;

Medical condition – diabetes; asthma history of a heart attack, angina, or coronary heart disease.

Serious mental illness – score of >13 on the Kessler-6 psychological distress scale.

Adult family home – licensed to provide housing and care services for up to six adults in a regular house located in a residential neighborhood. Nursing home – provides 24-hour supervised nursing care, personal care, therapy, nutrition management, organized activities, social services, room, board, and laundry.

Low-income housing – housing units managed by Spokane Housing Authority.
