



## WHERE IS IT MOST CONCERNING?

Spokane County does not exhibit adolescent birth or pregnancy rates higher than the state average, however, when you compare rates across the county, areas of need are easy to identify. Adolescent birth and pregnancy rates in the city of Spokane are most concerning and are considerably higher than those of Spokane County and Washington state. Airway Heights, Hillyard, and downtown Spokane exhibit the highest rates.
