

Water Recreation Facility Enforcement Procedure Summary

(This guide is for general assistance only and does not replace the actual enforcement procedure.)

Routine Inspection

Any red item violation requires a first reinspection within 30 days at a fee approved by the Board of Health.

For the purposes of this procedure, items 0110, 0111, 0120, and 0121 will be viewed as the same item number; items 0210, 0211, 0220, and 0221 will be viewed as the same item number; and items 0800, 0810, 0830, 0840 and 0850 will be viewed as the same item number. For example, if item 0110 is cited at the routine inspection, and item 0121 is cited at the first reinspection, it will be deemed a repeat violation and a second reinspection will be required.

Any repeat violation from the previous routine inspection requires a first reinspection within 30 days at a fee approved by the Board of Health.

All violations cited on the routine inspection report will be reinspected at the first reinspection, unless a separate compliance schedule has been established.

First Reinspection

If the first reinspection fee is not received by the date noted on the invoice, an additional late fee will be charged at the current rate.

Unless part of a compliance schedule, any repeat violation will result in a second reinspection within 10 working days at a fee approved by the Board of Health.

Second Reinspection

If the second reinspection fee is not received by the date noted on the invoice, an additional late fee will be charged at the current rate.

Unless part of a compliance schedule, any repeat violation will result in permit suspension, which will require closure of the facility.

Permit Reinstatement

The permit holder must provide a written statement to the Health District describing the correction of violation(s) and pay a reinstatement fee approved by the Board of Health. The Health District will conduct a reinspection of the corrected violation(s) within two (2) working days.

Additional Routine Inspection

An additional routine inspection will be conducted within 60 days of a second reinspection and/or reinstatement of a suspended permit.

Closure

If an inspection/reinspection results in the closure of a pool facility, a reinspection may be required prior to opening the pool. The permit holder must provide the Health District with a written statement describing the correction of the violation(s). A reinspection of the corrected violations will be conducted within two (2) working days. Applicable reinspection fees apply.
